Inland Water Transport – Technical Challenges and Opportunities

Durgapur Local Centre of the Institution in association with the West Bengal State Centre, IEI and the Institute of Marine Engineers (India), Kolkata Branch organized the Thirty-first National Convention of Marine Engineers and National Seminar on the theme 'Inland Water Transport – Technical Challenges and Opportunities' during October 15-16, 2017 at Kolkata. The Chief Guest, Mr Sisir Kumar Banerjee, President-Elect, IEI, was given a ceremonial guard of



honour by the cadets of the Indian Maritime University, Kolkata campus. In his inaugural address, Mr Banerjee stated that Inland Water Transport is a cheap, fuel-efficient, environment-friendly alternative mode of transport with high employment generation potential and is suitable for transporting heavy and bulky materials. He further spoke about the important inland water stretches including Ganga-Bhagirathi-Hoogly and Brahmaputra stretches. He also spoke about the methods adopted in reducing accidents through proper monitoring of vessels and training of personnel in Bangladesh. The other Guest-of-Honour, Mr Sudhir Kumar Sinha, Principal Officer & Joint Director General of Shipping, Mercantile Marine Department, Kolkata, in his address, emphasized upon the prospects of inland water transport for the tourism sector. The Guest-of-Honour and Keynote Speaker, Mr S V K Reddy, Chief Engineer, Inland Waterways Authority of India, through his audio visual presentation on the ongoing 'Jal Marg Vikas Project' informed the audience about the changes visualized in the field of water transportation in the country within the next five years. and risk is at lowest level and it is also a fact that these people are exposed to risks and are not aware of relevant safety aspect. He mentioned that it is the responsibility of the management to create awareness at grass root level. Dr Singh stressed that we need to be more vigilant as accidents happen mainly due to two main reasons i.e. ignorance and over-confidence. Lt Gen (Retd.) J S Ahluwalia, Chairman, Safety and Quality Forum (SQF), IEI, highlighted the alarming situation of lack of safety and poor accident records in India quoting that 50% of total road accidents worldwide occurs in India. He stressed the need to have umbrella legislation on safety for both organized and unorganized sectors as well as a part of education curriculum. Mr Pradeep Chaturvedi,

Chairman, Safety Convention and Council Member, IEI, mentioned that the high priority to safety issues given by the Institution and the presence of large number of Council members and experts

at the Convention proves the importance of safety. 'With advancement of technology and analytics, we are now equipped to get in-depth understanding of safety issues', added Mr Chaturvedi.
